Subject: Software Update Information

* This Service Bulletin is only for service information with following minor improvement to sets exhibiting the following symptoms. This is not call requiring the rework to be applied to stock units.

Symptom: 1. When a Zone A or Zone B remote control command is input to the RC IN or FLASHER IN, the unit enters the ZONE input mode and the MAIN ZONE TV screen displays information about ZONE, which interferes with viewers.

2. When the unit is connected to a Marantz power amp via the RC-5 bus, the power supply sometimes cannot be turned on or off if the remote controller's POWER ON/OFF button is held down for one second or more.

3. On the USB function, IR DISABLE/ENABLE cannot be switched over.

4. The HDCD indicator will not light up when the unit is switched from the function of playing HD-Audio (eg DTS-Master Audio) via HDMI to that of playing HDCD input via SPDIF.

Solution: The **MAIN CPU SOFTWARE** will be updated. The new version

number after the correction will be [V0901201].

The updated software to be used is 00M08DW499A02.zip.
